


Wildlife Quiz for Kids

- 1. Either frogs or toads.

- 3. False: there are also red squirrels, but they are less common despite being native!

- 5. Bees. They store it in wax structures called honeycombs.
- 6. Giraffe.
- 7. Black and white. They also have iridescent blue-green feathers.
- 8. A cub.
- 9. True. This is called echolocation, and it's how they navigate. They send out sound waves from their mouth or nose, which bounce off an object and return to the bats ears.
- 10. Four two on each side. They have forewings and hindwings.
- 11. Any three flowers can be accepted!
- 12. What hatches from a butterfly egg?
- 13. True: Spiders are arachnids!
- 14. Any stripy animal can be accepted!
- 15. Koala. Their diet of eucalyptus is impressive, considering it is poisonous to most animals!
- 16. Hedgehog. They are nocturnal; spending their days sleeping in nests built in thick undergrowth, under sheds, in leaf piles or unlit bonfires.
- 17. The answer is C Fat. Many people believe they store water in their humps. They keep the fat in one place instead of all over the body to help reduce the insulating effect, helping them survive in hot weather.
